Skanska has a strong commitment towards a more sustainable future, based on the belief that project development and construction can make a major contribution to a more sustainable society. Through our experience and expertise, Skanska can contribute by propose and deliver sustainable solutions to help customers, communities and other stakeholders to fulfill their environmental goals and need to build for resilience.

This Group Environmental Policy Statement is an extract from the Group Environmental Policy. The purpose of the Group Environmental Policy is to define common principles to effectively manage and promote environmental sustainability awareness within Skanska, in line with our values. The requirements of the Group Environmental Policy apply to all Skanska entities and employees.

Requirements

Skanska aims to continually improve the environmental performance of the projects, products and services, in order to reduce the environmental footprint of the business. This means, from a lifecycle perspective, to work for efficient use of energy, carbon, materials, waste and water as identified in the Skanska Color Palette™. Skanska further aim to mitigate negative environmental impact by reduce waste, emissions associated with climate change and pollution, harmful to people or environment. Also, the mitigation of negative impact from the operations on ecosystems should be properly handled.

Skanska supports and commits to international initiatives aimed at responsible corporate affairs such as the UN Global Compact, the UN Sustainable Development Goals and the UN Framework Convention on Climate Change (Paris Agreement). Skanska will engage with stakeholders in a transparent manner reporting on sustainability performance and impacts, using internationally acknowledged standards, such as the CDP (Carbon Disclosure Project) and GRI (Global Reporting Initiative). Projects financed through the Skanska Green Bond shall report the environmental impact to investors in accordance with the Skanska Green Bond Framework.

All business units shall comply with the ISO 14001 standard to ensure the use of an external verified management system that supports the management of environmental risks, continuous improvements and the compliance with environmental legislation. The Skanska Restricted Substance List should be followed. Skanska's commitment to the management of environmental risks goes beyond the Group to include business associates such as contractors and suppliers involved in our projects. The Skanska Supplier Code of Conduct should be used to ensure the environmental principles applicable to our business associates.

The Skanska Color Palette™, original or market adapted, shall be used by the business units when reporting on revenue or market value from green projects.
